







Nationality

Nationality is the first and foremost WBPSC Food SI eligibility criteria. As an applicant, you must meet one of the following conditions: You should be an Indian citizen, either by birth or through registration.

You can also be eligible if you are a national of another country, as declared by the Indian government.

Our second WBPSC Food SI eligibility criteria is Education, which includes the following:

You must have passed the Madhyamik Examination from the West Bengal Board of Secondary Education or its equivalent.

Moreover, you should have the ability to read, write, and speak Bengali or Nepali. However, if your mother tongue is Nepali, you are exempt from this requirement, as per Finance Department Notification No. 1243-F(P) dated February 23, 2016.

For candidates whose mother tongue is other than Bengali or Nepali, knowledge of Bengali will be tested during the personality test. Candidates with poor performance in this test may have their candidature cancelled.

Additionally, you should be in good health and capable of undertaking extensive travel in rural areas of West Bengal.

Age Limit

Our last WBPSC Food eligibility criteria is the age limit, which includes:

Your age should not be less than 18 years old.

Moreover, your age should not exceed 40 years.

It's important to emphasize that your age, as recorded in your Madhyamik or equivalent certificate, will be considered.

Furthermore, these age limits are applicable to all candidates, whether you are currently employed in a government position or not.

Age Relaxation

If you belong to the S.C. or S.T. category in West Bengal, you can have a 5-year relaxation in the upper age limit. Additionally, O.B.C. (Non-Creamy Layer) candidates from West Bengal are eligible for a 3-year upper age limit relaxation.

Moreover, for persons with benchmark disabilities (PwBD) with a disability level of 40% and above, the upper age limit can be extended up to 45 years.

However, please note that if you are an S.C., S.T., or O.B.C. candidate from a state other than West Bengal, you will be treated as a general candidate regarding age limits.



WBPSC Food SI Exam Pattern

In the WBPSC Food SI Recruitment exam pattern, you will encounter two main phases. Initially, you will go through a written examination, and if you qualify in the written exam, you will then proceed to the interview round, also known as the Personality Test.

Written Examination

In the written examination, you will find just one paper covering two subjects:

The subjects are General Studies and Arithmetic.

Further, the total marks for this paper are 100, with each subject carrying 50 marks.

You will have 1½ hours i.e. 90 minutes to complete the examination.

Moreover, the examination will involve multiple-choice objective-type questions.

Next, lets understand what is the personality test.

Personality test

In the personality test, the followings things will be considered:

The personality test is worth a total of 20 marks.

A specific number of candidates, chosen based on merit from the written exam results, will be invited for the personality test.

The final merit list will be crafted by combining the marks from the written examination and the personality test.

The Commission holds the authority to set qualifying marks for the written examination, personality test, and overall aggregate, as needed.



General Studies: This includes topics related to common experiences, everyday science, current events, and issues, with a particular focus on India. It also involves a basic understanding of Indian history and Indian geography.

Arithmetic: The questions will be formulated based on the syllabus of the Madhyamik Examination of the W.B.B.S.E. and will involve assessing mental ability.

WBPSC Food SI Salary

As a WBPSC Food SI, you will be positioned in Pay Level 6, which comes with a compensation package ranging from Rs. 22,700 to Rs. 58,500 as per the ROPA-2019 directives.

Furthermore, you will be entitled to receive Dearness Allowance (D.A.), Medical Allowance (M.A.), and House Rent Allowance (H.R.A.) in accordance with the prevailing regulations.
